

Greenbush Gardens 2019 Organic Seedlings

Cherry/Small Tomatoes:



Purple Bumble Bee

Crack resistant fruits with eye catching lime-green & bronze-purple striping. A complex sweet/tart flavor makes great it a great tomato to eat off the vine.



Riesentraube

Old German heirloom brought to Philadelphia in mid 1800's. Sweet, 1 oz. fruits grow in large clusters. Full, rich flavor with large yields.



Sungold(F-1)

Intense, fruity flavor and exceptionally sweet! Vigorous plant that grows all summer long, high yield but can crack with age.



Blue Berries

Beautiful deep purple/red color with a great flavor. Very ornamental plant that's attractive in containers, and great a conversation piece too!



White Cherry

Early and extremely productive pale yellow to ivory 1 oz. fruits with a sweet, fruity flavor. An excellent color addition to tomato platters.



Sweetie

A prolific producer and one of the sweetest cherries, with a 12-14% sugar content. Good crack resistance.



Blush

Visually stunning julienne cherry tomatoes with a sweet, juicy, tropical flavor. Great crack resistance.



Velvet Red

Striking silvery-gray, velvety foliage with heavy yields of 1" fruits with an excellent, sweet flavor.



Black Cherry

High yielding, dusky purple-brown, 1" fruits with a rich, sweet, complex flavor of a Brandywine.



Peacevine

A tremendous producer of 3/4" red fruit borne on trusses. Named because of it's high content of gamma amino butyric acid, which acts as a calming body sedative.



Esterina(F-1)

Massive yields on big clusters. An excellent, more disease and crack resistant alternative to Sungold. Flavor is very sweet and well balanced with a tangy kick



Chadwick Cherry (Camp Joy)

Large, disease resistant vines yield prolific amounts of very tasty large sized, 1+" cherry tomatoes borne in clusters. Named after Alan Chadwick, the originator of the bio-intensive method of gardening.




Green Tiger

Crack resistant fruits that reach 2" in length and have an amazing green and yellow striped coloring with a lime-green interior. Bold, sweet/acidic taste, these tomatoes are elongated and green when ripe.



Baxter's Early Bush

Compact plant produces heavy yields of tasty, large, red cherry tomatoes (2oz.). Perfect for growing in containers. Crack resistant. Determinate.



Principe Borghese

This is THE tomato to use for sun drying. Meaty, plum shaped 2 oz. fruits with very few seeds that grow in clusters. Good disease resistance. Determinate.



Lucia Grape

A super-crunchy red, grape tomato with a great tart/sweet taste. An early bearer with good crack resistance. Great in salads, on pizzas, in sauces.



Supersweet 100

A reliable cherry tomato with huge yields of sweet fruits on long branched clusters. Good resistance to fusarium wilt and verticillium wilt.



Gold Nugget

An early, prolific, golden cherry tomato with 1" slightly oval shaped fruit. These are healthy, compact plants with good disease resistance and a well balanced flavor.

Mid Size:



Box Car Willy

A smooth, red tomato with an acidic, old fashioned tomato flavor. Good crack and disease resistance and a heavy producer. 6-10 oz fruits are great for slicing, canning, or freezing.



Wapsipinicon Peach

Small, 2" fruits that are slightly fuzzy like a peach. Complex taste - spicy, sweet, and very fruity flavor. Great for snacking.



Tappy's Heritage

Beautiful, smooth, globe shaped fruit with a meaty texture Good disease resistance with great yields, and wonderful sweet, robust, flavor.



JauneDe Flamme

Prolific French heirloom with a persimmon-orange color and a sweet/tart, citrusy flavor. 4 oz., apricot sized fruits are great for fresh eating, sauces, and drying.



Abe Lincoln

An outstanding heirloom dating back to the '20's, this tomato produces huge crops of 8-10 oz. dark red, meaty and flavorful fruit that grow in large clusters.



Taxi

Bright yellow 4-6 oz. fruits are blemish free with sweet, meaty flesh. Great for the lunch box and adds beautiful color to salsas. Heavy yielder over a 3-4 week period. Determinate.



Green Zebra

A striking tomato that's a beautiful chartreuse color with lime green stripes. Rich tasting and tangy, this tomato is ideal sliced into wedges for salads. 3-4 oz. fruits are very productive over a long season.

Large/Beefsteak:



Ananas Noire (Black Pineapple)

An unusual Belgium heirloom with green, yellow and purple skin with bright green and red streaked flesh. Unique sweet, smoky, citrus flavor.

Black Krim

A Russian heirloom with dark maroon fruit and a rich, sweet flavor. Very juicy and delicious with productive vines.

Mortgage Lifter

A consistent taste winner! This huge 1-2 lb. heirloom beefsteak tomato is rich & meaty, with few seeds. Great for slicing, sandwiches, and salsas. Developed in the 1930's by a gardener who sold so many that he was able to pay off his mortgage!



Carbon

A beautiful purple-brown tomato with 10-14 oz. fruit & a delicious, rich, & complex flavor. Because of its productivity and flavor, Carbon is becoming popular to grow in commercial produce markets.

Oxheart

An old-fashioned favorite with heart-shaped pink fruit that weigh up to 1 pound. Very meaty flesh contains few seeds, great for slicing and sauces. Great flavor and productivity.

Pink Brandywine

Arguably the most popular heirloom vegetable of all time! It's old fashioned tomato taste is considered a benchmark for intense tomato flavor.



Aunt Ruby's German Green

Strong, sweet, smoky and fruity flavor. Very complex taste. Pick when they first start to soften (and turn a yellowish-green) for optimal taste.

Cherokee Purple

Pre-1890 Cherokee Indian heirloom with a perfect balance of sweet, acid, and savory. . . a must-try tomato! More disease tolerant than other dark tomatoes.

Kellogg's Breakfast

A beautiful orange beefsteak, heirloom tomato that originated in West Virginia. Very flavorful and superbly sweet. Looks beautiful in a tomato platter, and a great slicer too.



Granny Cantrell

Meaty, beefsteak-type tomato with delicious flavor and can grow up to 2 lbs. Named after Lettie Cantrell who received seeds from a WWII soldier returning from Germany.



Hillbilly

A huge, bicolored heirloom from West Virginia that has a brilliant yellow color with red marbling. Rich, sweet flavor, beautiful when sliced. Won our home-grown taste test a few years ago!



Paul Robeson

A Russian heirloom with a cult following among tomato connoisseurs. Intense, sweet, earthy, smoky taste. One of the first vines to ripen, fruit comes on hard and fast, then tapers off by late summer.



Green Giant

Outstanding, complex flavor - very sweet, earthy & juicy. The most productive and best tasting in many recent seed grower's trials. Beautiful, emerald green fruit. Another personal favorite!



Berkeley Pink Tie Dye

Compact plants produce beautiful 8-16 oz. port wine colored beefsteak with metallic green stripes. Very sweet, rich, dark tomato flavor.



German Johnson

1-2 lb. beefsteak tomatoes. Very flavorful, crack-resistant, and productive. Great for slicing, canning, or fresh eating.



Marianna's Peace

Large, 1-2 lb. pink-red beefsteak with a perfect balance of acidity and sweetness. An ideal BLT tomato and a "must have red" in my garden. A Czech heirloom, the seeds were given to Marianna (a 17year old escapee during WWII) by her father.



Black Brandywine

A beautiful heirloom that is superior for salsa, fresh eating, and cooking. Delicious deep, earthy and sweet flavor.



Prudens Purple

Early Brandywine type tomato with large 1 lb.+ sized fruits that resist cracking. Vivid dark pink skin with crimson flesh, few seeds, and a wonderful sweet flavor.



Dester

This German heirloom has won numerous taste competitions. Huge, 1-2 lb. pink beefsteaks with a rich, sweet flavor that grow on massive plants. A great red slicing tomato.



Gold Medal

An abundant producer of very large, 1-2 lb., meaty fruits with an amazing color - sunset orange with red marbling. Outstanding flavor, somewhat fruity and sweet with low acidity. A gold medal winner in many taste tests.



Aussie

A beautiful, glossy red, fluted, beefsteak tomato that can weigh up to 2 lbs. Aussie has a bold flavor with great balance of sugar and acid for a full old-fashioned tomato taste. Good disease resistance, a great show tomato.



Yellow Brandywine

Sweet, rich tasting heirloom with a similar flavor, appearance, and plant habit to Brandywine, with large gold fruits. Golden flesh is smooth and juicy, with relatively low acids. Pick just before ripe to avoid cracking.



Julia Child

These plants produce a good yield of deep pink beefsteak tomatoes that are very flavorful, sweet, and juicy. Perfect for sandwiches, salads, and slicing. An heirloom tomato named by Gary Ibsen (TomatoFest) after the famous French chef, Julia Child.



Persimmon

A beautiful rose orange heirloom tomato that dates back to the mid 1800's. Thin skinned with meaty flesh, it has a sweet fruity flavor with low acidity. Good late blight resistance.

Plum/Paste:



Olpaka

Polish heirloom from early 1900's. Up to 6" long, productive fruits that are great for sauce, paste, roasting. and even fresh



Pink Icicle

Very sweet & rich, perfect for salsas, preserving or eating fresh. Incredibly productive. Originated from the Ukraine.



Orange Icicle

Sweet, rich & flavorful with strong citrus overtones. Makes great salsa, sauce, and attractive on tomato platters. Very productive.



Rutgers

An old classic NJ heirloom that produces large yields of delicious, 8 oz. red globes. Great for canning and excellent fresh. Good disease and crack resistance.



Roma

Superior 2 oz., thick walled and meaty paste-type tomato with few seeds. A 1950's heirloom that is compact and determinate.



San Marzano

Traditional Italian heirloom/ paste tomato with heavy yields and richly flavored 2 oz. fruits. A classic for Italian tomato



Grandma Mary's

A heavy yielding heirloom tomato from Maine with large, meaty, plum shaped red fruits and very few seeds. 3-4 oz.



Amish Paste

Bright red, 8-10 oz. fruits that vary in shape from oxheart to rounded plum. Juicier than most paste tomatoes, it's great for eating fresh with a rich and sweet taste, yet meaty enough for sauce.

Pepper Varieties

Hot Peppers:



Anaheim

Heirloom from New Mexico and very popular in SouthWestern cuisine. Great roasted, in egg/vegetable dishes, or stuffed chili rellenos. 2,500 Scovilles.



Jalapeno

Arguably the most famous hot chili pepper in the world. Great in salsas, stuffed poppers, jam, or smoke the red ones to make chipotle peppers. 3,500-8,000 Scovilles.



Pasilla Bajio

Mexican heirloom pepper used in "mole" sauces. Mild-sweet-hot that starts as dark green and turns brown as it ripens.



Cayenne Long

Slender, 6" long peppers are fiery hot and great to use in salsas, chili, stir fries, or dried & ground for cayenne pepper. 30,000-50,000 Scovilles.



Padron

A heirloom pepper from Galicia, Spain, where the bite sized fruits are sauted in olive oil with sea salt and served in tapas bars. Fairly mild with the occasional unpredictable hot one.



Shishito

A favorite old Japanese heirloom variety that produces 3" long fruit. Mildly flavored with just a bit of spice it is perfect for making tempura, grilling, in stir fries. Approximately one in ten is hot.



Poblano

Old variety from Puebla, Mexico. Great in salsa, stuffed, in mole sauces, or dried (when dried they're called ancho chilis). Fairly mild, 4" long peppers, 1,000-2,000 Scovilles.



Habanero

A really hot pepper with a Scoville rating of 200,000-300,000. Great for hot sauces and basting. A beautiful pepper that grows well in containers.



Bhut Jolokia (Ghost)

Native to India and one of the hottest peppers in the world, with a Scoville rating of 1,000,000+!! Only recommended for hard core hot pepper enthusiasts!



Thai Hot

Small conical peppers that ripen to bright red and stand erect above the foliage. Ornamental and great in pots, pinch when young for 8" bushy plants. 25,000-40,000 Scoville rating.



Serrano Tampiqueno

A Mexican favorite that is best used fresh. Plants are 2'-3' in height and produce plentiful 1-1/2" fruits. Heat scale is 20,000-30,000 Scovilles.



Fish

An heirloom variety popular in the mid-Atlantic region, this pepper was originally brought to the U.S. from the Caribbean in the 19th century. Distinctive, vividly striped fruits pair with beautiful variegated foliage. Heat can range from 5,000-30,000 Scovilles.



Aji Crystal

A hot pepper originally from Chile, that ripens from a pale yellowish-green, to a orange-red, and finally to a bright red. The hot, lemony/citrus flavor is best when peppers are picked when they are young. 20,000-40,000 Scovilles.



Ring of Fire

Cayenne type pepper with a glossy sheen and a fire engine red pepper. 4" long peppers are great fresh, dried as chili flakes, or in powders. Heat rating 20,000 Scovilles.



Hungarian Hot Wax

Smooth, waxy, 6" long fruits ripen from yellow to orange to red. Pickle all 3 colors for a beautiful hot pepper medley, slice in rings for salads or pizza, or grill whole. Very prolific producer. 5,000-10,000 Scovilles



Tunisian Baklouti

A moderately hot pepper (2,000-5,000) from North Africa's famous Barbary Coast. Traditionally used to make a paste called harissa, but also great for salsas, pickling or roasting. Heat is milder if cooked.

Sweet Peppers:



New Ace

Earliness and high yields characterize this bell pepper hybrid. Perfect for short growing seasons in



Jimmy Nardello

An heirloom variety from Basilicata, Southern Italy & brought to the U.S. in the late 1800's. Fantastic on the grill, with an intense, sweet, fruity taste. Also good for frying, drying, or fresh eating. Up to 10" long.



Purple Beauty

Beautiful purple fruits that are beautiful in a salad, with a mild and sweet taste. Thick walled, blocky peppers that grow on compact, bushy plants.



Gilboa

A bright orange pepper loaded with up to a dozen thick walled bell peppers per plant. Engaging fruity flavor.



Sweet Banana

Mild, yellow/green peppers ultimately turn red. An heirloom from the 40's that is still popular today. Great on pizza, in salads, fried or pickled.

Pippin's Golden Honey

A colorful sweet pepper that ripens from a deep purple, to a bright honey-mustard, to a golden orange. 3-4" fruits are great for fresh eating, pickling, or stuffing. Named after Horace Pippin, a Philly area folk artist.



Bridge to Paris

Smooth, sweet, thick walled fruits are up to 10" long and are perfect for roasting, frying, grilling, or fresh eating. A wonderful introduction by the Hudson Valley Seed Company.



Giant Aconcagua

An Argentinian heirloom named after the highest mountain in South America. Best to stake as fruit is huge, up to 12" long, and plant gets up to 3' tall. Sweet and fruity, this pepper matures from green, to orange, to red.




